If a child misses just one day a week, over the course of their school career they will miss two years of schooling and their chances of achieving their potential will be at risk.


If you need any help or support, please do get in touch with us by speaking to your child's year team in the first instance.

School and Parent communication

As a school we always want to communicate with parents and encourage parents to communicate with us, however, we are a school of over 1500 students and as parents I am sure you appreciate that at times, we find it very difficult to respond to demands of a call back on the day of a call. We have a policy that states that we will endeavour to call parents back within 24 hours unless it is clearly an emergency.

We are also finding an increasing number of parents attending the school demanding to speak to staff, which is impossible when we have staff who are teaching and staff who may be involved in other meetings or training.

I therefore ask that you follow the advice that is given to all parents:

- Please only call the school if there is an emergency eg. You need to collect your child for an appointment that you have managed to arrange that day, there is a safeguarding issue that needs to be addressed.
- Only attend the school if you are collecting your child, dropping off an item of equipment that they may have forgotten or you have an appointment.
- Please call the school absence line (0121 556 4131 ext 230) or email the absence email address (WGA.absence@woodgreenacademy.co.uk), before 8am, if your child is going to be absent. Please clearly state the following:

Challenge Days

Final arrangements are now being made for Challenge Days. All payments must now be made straight away and in full, through Parent Pay. Those who have not chosen activities will be assigned on-site activities.

Specific information regarding activities eg clothing, times of trips, will be shared via ClassCharts nearer to the time.

School Rules and Behaviour

One of the reasons, aside from excellent teaching, that ensures we get excellent outcomes for our students, is the high expectations that we have at Wood Green in terms of student behaviour. Can I thank parents/carers for supporting us with this.

Mobile Phones

Once again please can I thank the vast majority of parents/carers that ensure that their child does not bring their mobile phone to school, however, there have been a number of incidents in the last half term that we have had to deal with, therefore for clarity, students in years 7 – 11 **MUST NOT** bring mobile phones onto the school site. If there is an emergency safeguarding reason for a student to have a mobile phone on them on the journey to and from school, that parents **MUST** request temporary permission from Mrs Wood in writing with the understanding that the phone MUST be handed in to YL/SSM each day for the period of time that the emergency safeguarding reason is in place.

Students should not use their mobile phone as their bus pass/ticket as mobile phones are not permitted on the school site. If a student brings a phone onto the school site and it is

confiscated, parents will need to either purchase an additional bus pass/ticket or will have to make alternative arrangements for their child's transport.

If students are found to be in possession of a mobile phone it will be confiscated and placed in the school safe. Mobile phones confiscated on a Monday or Tuesday will be held in the school safe until the end of the school week where they can only be collected by parents/carers between 2.40-3.00pm (in the event of school finishing early, phones due to be collected, can be picked up between from the end of school and the following 20 minutes e.g. 12.00 and 12.20pm.). Phones confiscated on a Wednesday, Thursday or Friday will be confiscated until the end of the following school week where they can only be collected by parents/carers between 2.40-3.00pm. If, however, the return of the mobile phone falls in a school holiday, the phone can be collected on the first day back to school by parents/carers between 2.40 -3.00pm with the exception of the summer holiday, in which case the phone can be collected by parents/carers on the first Friday of the holidays between 2.40 -3.00pm. So, if a phone is confiscated on Wed 17th July or Thurs 18th July, it will not be returned until Friday 26th July 2024 (between 2.40 - 3.00pm) as per our policy. EXCEPTIONS to this policy will not be made and ANY student that refuses to hand in their mobile phone when asked to, will be issued with a Permanent Exclusion. This sanction has been consistently applied where in the rare occasions this has happened in the past.

Student Achievements

Young Writers Anthology

We are delighted to share that Thomas Hind (Shakespeare) and Lacie Powell (Einstein) have been chosen for publication in the Young Writers' 'Mission Catastrophe: Redemption Stories' anthology. During extra-curricular sessions, they have been motivated to imagine, write and redraft these stories and now they have been rewarded with such well-deserved recognition. Having these students' work chosen is something to be proud of; it doesn't happen every day and we are so pleased that they are inspired and engaged with their creative writing. Alongside the other students who have contributed to this national programme, Thomas and Lacie's stories will be published in the Autumn.

STEM High Performance Sport Analysis

Miss Parker (SGO) arranged for a group of A level and BTEC National sixth formers and two younger elite swimmers, to meet Ollie Logan who works for Swim Britain. Ollie has already worked at four Olympic Games as a performance analyst and is preparing for Paris with the British swimming team. He delivered a seminar on STEM in high performance sport – specifically swimming. The group, under Ollie's guidance analysed performance and made recommendations based on their findings. - West Bromwich Albion Player Appearance from the first team, delivered a session and discussion to the girls football club, player was Olivia Rabjohn


