




# Support from Home


- Share your concerns with us and keep us up to date

- Mobile phones are not allowed in school.





# Online safety

### **Advice to Parents**

- Delay giving smartphones
- Increase child's engagement in real world clubs, sports, family time
- Use parental controls on phones, Check your child's device
- Phone free time (evenings and before sleeping)
- Phone free areas (unsupervised spaces, eg bedrooms)
- Spend quality time talking and doing things with your child
- As they get older encourage them to engage with adults in part time jobs, volunteering

# Attendance – do you know?

- Students attending over 95% (up to 2 weeks missed) are twice as likely to achieve grade 5 in English & Maths than students attending 90% of the time (up to 4 weeks missed).
- The majority of students who have an absence in the first full week in September, remain 'Persistently Absent' for the remainder of the Academic year.

# What we need from parents/carers


- To send your son/daughter in EVERY day so they can be successful.

# PE Kit

- House T-shirt with WGA logo
- Black plain shorts or plain black joggers\*
  - \*Joggers should be plain, no branded logos e.g. Nike.
  - \*Joggers should not be fleeced lined or leggings style.
  - \*School branded joggers are preferred however; not mandatory.
- Suitable trainers
- Plain black zip up fleece\* (optional)
  - \*No branded logos e.g. Nike/North Face. Fleece must be plain.
  - \*Quarter zips acceptable.
  - \*School branded fleece is preferred however; not mandatory.

  - Must be plain and black.












# <u>Hair</u>

- No 'V' cuts.
- No tramlines/patterns cut into hair.
- Must be of one natural colour.
- No highlights.
- No hair extensions.
- Hair clips must be black/dark green.
- Short spikes only on top, none at the back.
- No extreme hairstyles.

Students will be in isolation until it is sorted (notes will not do).



# <u>Jewellery</u>



- 1 plain, small, round gold/silver stud per ear.
- 1 watch (not a smart watch)
- No nose or other piercings allowed.
- Repeat offenders confiscated and put in school safe until Friday 3:00pm (Parents to collect).
- If not removed excluded for defiance.
- NB. Don't get your child's ear pierced over the summer, if they are not willing to remove them for PE in September.

# **Other reminders**

- Make-up none
- Tattoos none
- Mobiles none
  - If a student is caught with a mobile phone this will be confiscated, and a parent will have to collect it after 5 school days.
- All students must have a reading book and pencil case.

At WGA, ClassCharts is our main portal for information and communication with parents.

- School letters and announcements
- Parent/carers reporting absences with option to add medical evidence e.g. medical appointment letters.
- Student timetable
- Student homework

It is very important that parents and carers have access to the ClassCharts app.

The app will provide push notifications to mobile devices for the communications listed above.

# Homework

- There are sanctions for incomplete homework or homework that has not been completed to a high enough standard.
- They will receive multiple pieces of HW a day/week.
- Students must check ClassCharts daily to monitor homework set and deadlines.

### FAQs - general/transition

- What time can I drop my child off?
  - Between 8:00am-8:30am
- What time do they finish?
  - 2:30pm both induction days. Usual finish time is 3:00pm
- What if they are waiting for a sibling?
  - They must wait at Newton Gate.
- What if they are unable to make Summer School?
  - Note this down on the Summer School form.
- Where do I purchase Wood Green Academy Uniform?
  - Clive Marks, Crested School Wear, First Choice Uniforms, CC Uniforms. Most suppliers allow you to place orders online.
- Are there any discounts for uniforms?
  - Vouchers are included in the pack issued tonight from some suppliers.
- Can my child wear a skirt?
  - No our uniform policy does not include a skirt.
- What if they have a dietary requirement/ medication condition/allergy?
  - Put all this information in the admissions forms online.
- Is there a Y7 Parents Evening?
  - Yes, TBC in September
- How do I reapply for Free School Meals?
  - This will be covered in the Hall Talk from Head Teacher

- Where can they go at break/lunch time?
  - Canteen, field, playground, extra-curricular clubs, Learning Hub.
- Are there extra-curricular activities available?
  - Yes lunch/afterschool. Schedule will be provided in September of clubs on offer.
- Is there an opportunity to play an instrument?
  - Yes express interest in September
- Is there a Y7 Residential Trip?
  - Yes Spring Term to Edgmond Hall. Dates TBC.
- How can I report an absence?
  - Via the ClassCharts App or phone the school before 8:30am.
- What if my child is late?
  - They must sign in at Reception.
- What is my child feels ill in the day?
  - They will be directed to our Student Welfare Officer (Mrs Yates) in the medical room.
- What if my child is struggling?
  - Who can help? Year Leader, SSM, Form Tutor, all staff.
- What support is available for SENCo students?
  - A strong SENDCO Department led by Ms Fox.
- When is the first day of school?
  - Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September. Full school day: 8:30am-3:00pm
