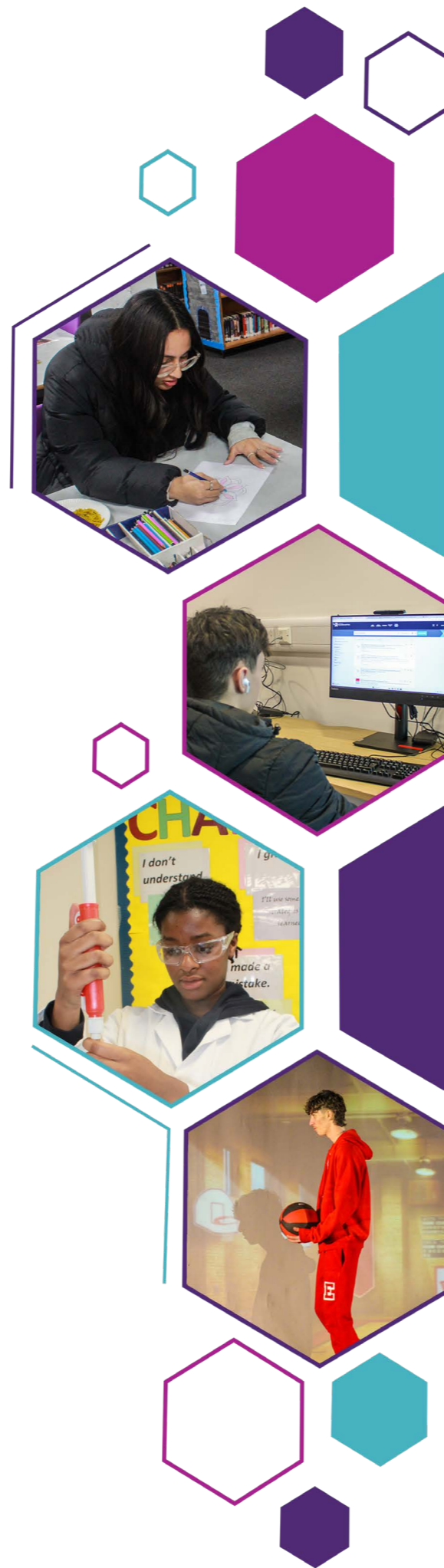

PATHWAY REQUIREMENTS

To study with us at Wood Green Academy, you'll need at least a grade 4 in Maths and a grade 4 in English (Language or Literature). From there, you can choose the route that suits you best: our A-Level pathway, our combined pathway, or our vocational pathway.

A-LEVEL SUBJECTS (A-LEVEL PATHWAY/ COMBINED)

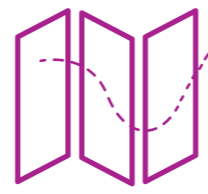
The entry criteria to study a subject at A-Level are: a minimum of 5 GCSEs at grades 9–5, including at least a grade 5 in either English (Language or Literature) or Maths. In addition, the specific subject entry requirements must also be met.

VOCATIONAL PATHWAY

The entry criteria for the Vocational Pathway are: a minimum of 5 GCSEs at grades 9–4, including at least a grade 4 in Maths and a grade 4 in either English Language or English Literature. In addition, the specific subject entry requirements must also be met.

Applicants can choose three subjects from each vocational block. Students can combine vocational and A-level pathways if the entry requirements are met. AAQs are a new level qualification designed to complement existing level 3 courses.

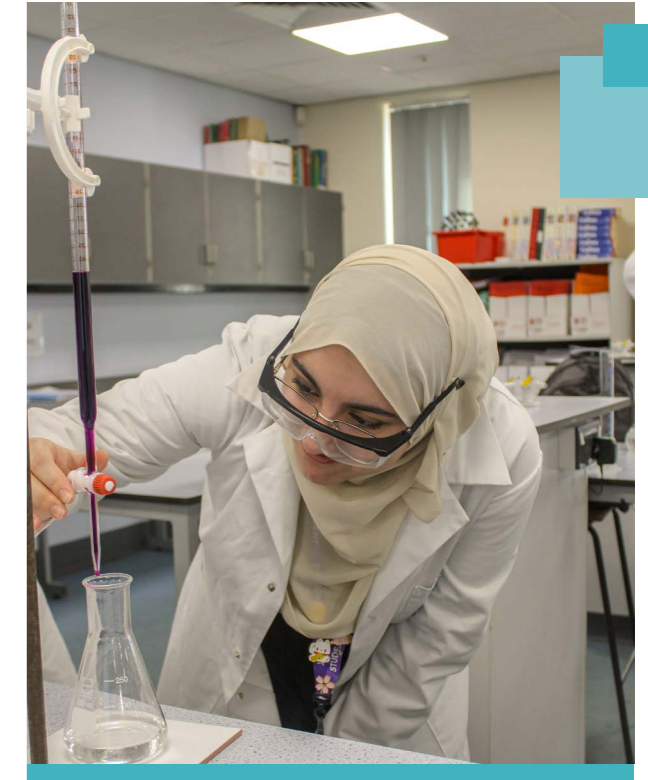

SIXTH FORM AMBASSADORS

The ambassador programme at Wood Green Academy gives students an opportunity to develop a range of skills that will prepare them for life after Year 13.

Students get involved in taking a lead role in the delivery of activities, charity events and the mentoring of younger students. The successful applicants will act as internal and external ambassadors of the school and will act as role models for all students at Wood Green Academy.

Ambassadors have previously taken part in the organisation of events to raise money for 'Movember Macmillan Cancer support', the 'British Heart Foundation' and 'Smile For Joel'. They also play an important part in ensuring that the views of Sixth Form students are shared appropriately and through the correct channels and structures.

The Sixth Form ambassadors lead sessions on the Year 12 induction days, sharing their experiences of Wood Green Academy with prospective students, giving key tips on the transition up to Post-16 studies. Sixth Form ambassadors have also visited the Houses of Parliament.

DISCOVER MORE ABOUT OUR HIGHER EDUCATION SUPPORT



At Wood Green Academy, we are keen to support students with the next steps in their education. We work with external organisations who provide guidance with decision-making when it comes to university choices.

THE ACCELERATE PROGRAMME – THE ACCESS PROJECT

Wood Green Academy is one of 35 schools in the country that works with The Access Project. We have a University Access Officer in school one day a week who can offer advice and guidance with a focus on applications to top universities.



THE ACCELERATE PROGRAMME

Each year, 30 students in Years 12 and 13 take part in the Accelerate Programme. The programme helps students develop the skills, knowledge, and confidence they need to succeed in higher education. Participants benefit from regular mentoring, university-focused workshops, and one-to-one guidance on applications and personal statements. They also visit selective universities and complete online modules to gain valuable insight into competitive courses. Alongside this, students take part in structured coaching sessions to strengthen essential skills such as communication, organisation, collaboration, and problem-solving. This support empowers them to make ambitious university choices, submit strong applications, and prepare for a successful transition to life beyond Sixth Form.



My time at Wood Green Sixth Form has been an unforgettable journey that shaped me both academically and personally. As a student ambassador, I had the privilege of representing the school during open evenings and other events, which gave me the chance to develop confidence and communication skills. I also enjoyed setting up clubs for younger students and working as a peer support ambassador, where I held sessions with those who were struggling in school. Supporting others became one of the most rewarding and meaningful parts of my Sixth Form experience. Lessons were always engaging and inspiring, and I never felt as though I was facing challenges on my own. My teachers were consistently supportive and went above and beyond to help me succeed. AMAZING FACILITIES

This is an area to relax and socialise between studying, and helps our students to feel refreshed and ready to learn – whether they are chatting with their peers, making use of the wide, flat-screen television, or simply having a cup of tea.

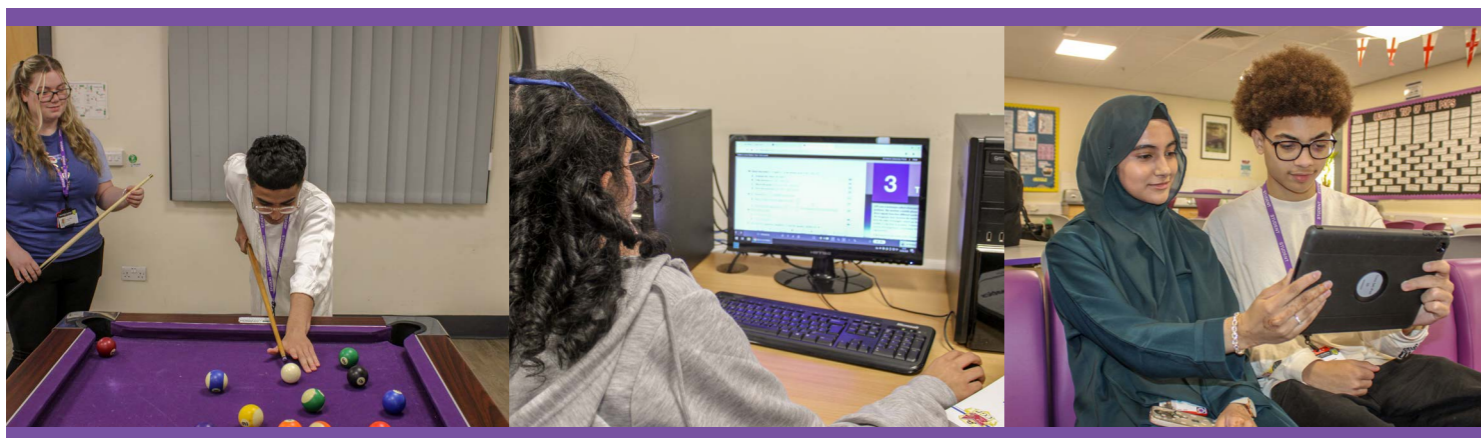
ICT SUITES & EQUIPMENT

The Sixth Form area has two additional study rooms: an ICT Suite fully-equipped with computers and printing facilities, and another study space overlooking the school field, where students have the opportunity to focus on their work in a quiet and reflective environment. All Sixth Form students are also provided with a device such as a laptop to aid them in their studies.

THE LEARNING HUB

The Learning Hub is a wonderful multi-purpose space: we host a library of over 9000 books to aid with personal and academic growth; we have a newly updated computer suite with access to printing; the Learning Hub team facilitates tutoring and guided revision sessions as well as allowing time for independent study. As the “hub” of the school, the space is also used to host various themed events throughout the year, all of which contribute to the culture of learning and development that Wood Green Academy is known for.

A safe and inclusive space for all, The Learning Hub is open to Sixth Form students before, during and after school.



My experience at Wood Green Sixth Form has been nothing short of amazing. Although there were some challenging days (mainly due to the depth of A-Level content compared to GCSE), with the support of the brilliant teachers at Wood Green, I was able to overcome these challenges and stay up to date with all my notes. Some top tips I would recommend: Make your revision materials as you go along. I found this incredibly valuable, as it meant that when it came to end-of-topic tests, mocks, and final A-Level exams, I didn't have to waste time creating revision notes. Instead, I could focus on reviewing the content. Another tip is to do as many past questions and papers as physically possible. This really helped me master the skills required for each Assessment Objective (AO). The teachers at Wood Green are always available to help and are more than happy to mark your work and provide feedback. This was especially useful in A-Level Business. I went from scoring 10/20 to achieving 20/20 in my final exams (anything is possible if you put in the work). Work experience is also vital, especially in a career you're aiming to pursue. With the support of the staff at Wood Green Academy, I was able to complete a placement at the Magistrates' Court. This experience helped solidify my ambition to become a lawyer. I'm incredibly thankful for my time at Wood Green Academy Sixth Form. It has provided me with countless opportunities (both academically and personally) and has helped me develop the confidence to now go on and study Law at the University of Birmingham. Final words: Keep calm and enjoy your Sixth Form experience, it's truly one to remember!
