In the average primary school class, at least two children have suffered abuse or neglect. But it doesn't have to be this way. That's why we developed Speak out Stay safe.

Our free safeguarding programme is:

- available to all primary schools
- linked to the curriculum
- introduced by Ant and Dec.

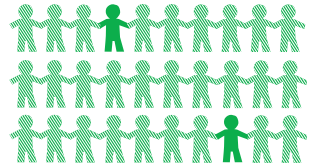
It empowers you to tackle a difficult topic with your students.

It helps children understand:

- abuse in all its forms and the signs of abuse
- abuse is never a child's fault
- sources of help available to them, including Childline.

How does it work?

Virtual assemblies, engaging lesson plans and face-to-face workshops are all part of Speak out Stay safe.

Assemblies are available:

- for ages 5-7 and 7-11
- in English, Welsh and with BSL incorporated.

Lesson plans:

- include engaging activities and resources
- are available in English and Welsh.

Face-to-face workshops:

- can be requested for your area
- are delivered by trained volunteers with the help of our mascot, Buddy
- cover topics like abuse and bullying in an age-appropriate way
- have teachers present throughout.

For children with additional needs and disabilities our Speak out Stay safe SEND/ASN/ALN programme is available.
