Do you like Minecraft? Do you want to learn more about careers? <u>The CareersCraft world</u> allows players to develop careers skills and awareness as they visit landmarks across Wales. CareersCraft is played using Minecraft. It is an interactive way for learners to explore careers topics using a platform that is familiar and popular with many people.



The <u>Young Professionals student network</u> is designed for engaged and career-driven students. Their resources and work experience opportunities enable you to engage with employers and discover what it's like to work in different sectors. Upcoming opportunities include Direct Line Group's two-day Business Simulation work experience in London in August.



If you plan to research universities over the summer, you'll be interested to know that <u>UCAS have a webpage devoted to sourcing virtual university tours</u> and videos that will give you a flavour of what the faculties and campus are like and insight into the facilities available. If a university you're interested in isn't listed, you can use the <u>UCAS 'Unibuddy' service</u>, that allows you to search by course or university and chat to current undergraduates to get real-time information and honest opinions.



The <u>University of London group</u> offers one-day or half-day Taster Courses at 13 participating universities in the city. There are over 100 courses to choose from and they are free to attend. You can use a course to check if a subject you already like will suit you, or try something completely new.
